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GUIDELINES FOR POSTERS

Frontiers in Immunology Research 2011 International Conference

Le Meridien Lav Hotel, Split - Croatia, July 1-4, 2011

- Posters will be displayed in the hallways of the headquarters hotel for the 2011 FIRN Conference.
- Posters will be grouped and identified as a Section poster (e.g. FIRN Section on Immune Responses to Infectious Diseases posters).
- FIRN will provide the easels and the poster presenter will provide the poster.
- FIRN will schedule an hour for your Sections posters to be presented during the Conference. The current plan is to have one day during the Event with three one hour time slots assigned to poster presentations. The posters will be presented in the hallways of the hotel at the same time that Section programming will be taking place. If FIRN receives too many Section posters to fit in the appropriate space, we will have presenters for each time slot place their poster on the easel for that hour. However, poster presenters should be prepared to leave their posters up throughout the Event since posters will only be replaced if there is insufficient room for all of the posters.
- Posters should easily read from 2-3 feet away. Text should be limited to the core ideas and presented in a font size that allows our aging academics to read it with ease. Experienced poster presenters suggest 3-6 graphics to mix in with your text to make the posters more engaging.
- Posters should be mounted on a hard backing such as foam core that can be placed on an easel and not exceed 3ft x 4ft (36 x 48 inches); hard backing and easels will be provided by FIRN. (FIRN does not provide any design services or construction materials; for such services and materials, contact *Mega Print Inc.* <<http://www.postersession.com/>>.) Please note that electricity to the posters will not be provided.
- Each poster presenter will be responsible for getting his or her poster to and from the Conference.
- More detailed information will be sent to poster presenters once they are selected and confirmed.
